- Alaska Inside Passage** — A narrow waterway surrounded by 1,000-foot icy cliffs. You'll find water and wildlife mix quite nicely in this haven for kayakers, anglers and glacier-gazers.

Hubbard Glacier — It's one of the most active and longest tidewater glaciers in North America, with 1,350 square miles of blue ice.

Icy Strait Point — Nestled in an old-growth rain forest, it offers whale-watching, grizzly-gazing and seal-spotting as well as a taste of Tlingit culture.
- Juneau, Alaska** — Alaska's capital sits at the base of Mt. Juneau and is surrounded by salt water—an ideal jumping-off point for tons of outdoor action.

Ketchikan, Alaska — Granite cliffs, 1,000-foot waterfalls, crystalline lakes and low-hanging mists. Need we say more.

Skagway, Alaska — With over 20 shore excursions, including dog-sledding and a wilderness safari, it's no wonder Skagway is Alaska's "fun city."

ICE BOLD ADVENTURES

Hubbard Glacier

Nature generally takes her time. Alaska's dramatic mountain ranges and ruggedly beautiful seascapes were carved out by glaciers over thousands of years. Today, most of these giant masses of ice are slowly receding, with one notable exception. The mighty Hubbard — the continent's biggest tidewater glacier — is growing larger by the day and moving quickly toward the Gulf of Alaska. Traveling by sea, cruisers experience the awe-inspiring sight of the towering frozen river of blue ice. It's also a unique opportunity to witness the power of nature as Hubbard reshapes the region around Yakutat Bay.

Even by the standards of the Great Land, Hubbard is huge, covering 1,350 square miles. It stretches 76 miles from Canada's Yukon toward the sea until it meets Disenchantment Bay. There the glacier stands some 350 feet tall and about seven miles across, and is advancing at the astonishing rate of 30 feet per day. With that relentless movement comes constant calving.

Yakutat Bay

This phenomenon is one of nature's greatest spectacles, as chunks of melting ice the size of buildings break off and crash into the frigid waters of the bay. The sound of cracking ice is so loud, the native peoples called it "White Thunder." You can appreciate this wonder of nature from almost anywhere onboard *Radiance of the Seas*. The ship is designed for scenic sailing, with a glass-enclosed central atrium, elevators facing out to the sea, and floor-to-ceiling windows throughout in addition to the ample outdoor deck space. Plus the captain will slowly turn the ship around in the bay several times, to ensure that everyone has the chance to take in the great views. Joining the captain in the bridge is a National Park Ranger, who'll describe the action as it unfolds — and keep a trained eye out for the humpback and orca whales that often frolic in the surrounding coves.



CHOOSE YOUR MEMORIES

DISCOVER ALASKA WHALES (JUNEAU)

The hands-on science of marine biology meets scenic sightseeing on this whale-watching expedition from Juneau. While cruising Stephens Passage in a safari-style vessel, your guide leads you through activities that support local research organizations, such as monitoring for invasive species, collecting plankton samples, identifying humpback whales and observing other marine mammals. In addition to the pods of humpbacks, these waterways are home to orcas, Stellar sea lions, Dahl's porpoises, and harbor seals.



GREAT ALASKAN LUMBERJACK SHOW AND AXE CHALLENGE (KETCHIKAN)

Meet some of Alaska's famed woodsmen in the port of Ketchikan. It's man against tree — and each other — as lumberjacks compete to see who can chop, saw and climb the fastest. It takes some fancy footwork to be the last one standing while rolling a log. Then see if you've got what it takes when the timber pros invite the show attendees to join in an axe-throwing contest.



DENALI FLYER (TALKEETNA)

Fly to the remote western end of Denali National Park for the best views of the three biggest mountains of the Alaska Range and the glacier that connects them. Kahiltna Glacier, the longest glacier in the range, begins on the Great One's southwest slope, at around 10,000 feet, and extends between Mount Foraker and Mount Hunter. The aerial tour takes you over the glacier's south fork, where climbers preparing to scale Denali set up base camp at 7,000 feet.



HUSKY HOMESTEAD (DENALI)

Jeff King knows what it takes to put together a winning team of sled dogs. The four-time champion of the Iditarod race opens his kennel to small groups of visitors for a personal tour. There you'll meet the canines who've led King to triumph and visit with the puppies that are being groomed for future competition. Training is year-round and intense, so you'll get to see the summer regimen in action.



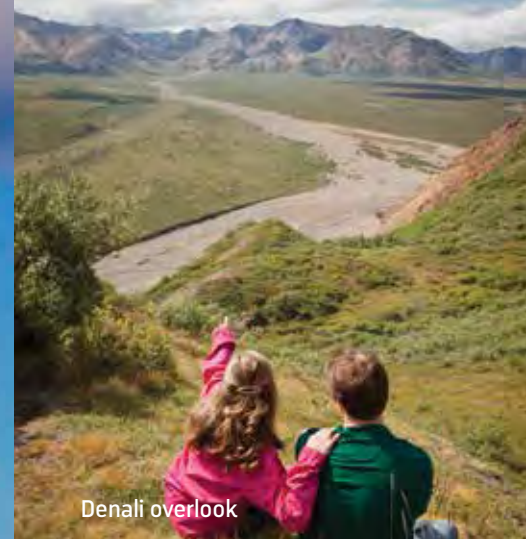
TAKE INCREDIBLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

DENALI - SIX MILLION ACRES OF UNTAMED BEAUTY.

In the center of the Alaska Range, the alpine landscapes of taiga forest and vast tundra rise up to meet giant glaciers and rugged mountains covered in snow. Towering high above them all is Denali, North America's tallest peak at 20,310 feet. In the Athabaskan language, its name means "The Great One." Central to the cultural heritage of the native peoples who have lived here for thousands of years, the giant mountain is the ultimate symbol of the Alaskan wild. Here the United States established the world's first park expressly designated for the conservation of wildlife. A century later, Denali National Park remains a wild kingdom, where animals, large and small, roam free.

The park's most famous residents are the Big Five: Dall sheep, wolves, caribou, moose and the mighty grizzly bear. But they are far from alone. More than 30 other mammals, the red fox and arctic squirrel among them, also live here. And come summer, they are joined by more than 160 species of migratory birds.

For the best chances at spotting wildlife, you'll travel along the park's lone road that stretches for miles into the backcountry. Ride through the lowland forests of spruce, poplar and hardy shrubs up to the river valleys dotted with wildflowers and onwards to wide-open tundra covered in mosses, ferns, grasses and bushes of wild berries. It's a journey that showcases the beauty of Denali's distinct habitats.

Active outdoor adventures can be found in the park's front country. Dozens of walking, hiking and biking trails begin at the park entrance. River rafting, flight seeing and sled-dog summer camps are close by. And no visit is complete without spending time at the Denali Park Visitor Center. Staffed by welcoming park rangers, the center does double-duty as a natural history museum. Its acclaimed exhibits vividly tell the story of Denali, from its emergence out of the Ice Age to the subarctic environment we see today.

ANCHORAGE - FRONTIER FLAIR IN THE BIG CITY.

Set between the sparkling waters of Cook Inlet and the dramatic snow-capped Chugach Mountains, Anchorage is Alaska's biggest city. Nearly half of the state's estimated 738,000 human residents live here, along with sizeable populations of bears and moose. Few places in the world can match its appealing blend of metropolitan pursuits and outdoor living. Where else can you see office workers casting fishing lines at lunch time?

Anchorage is at its most exuberant during the summer, when locals make the most of the mild temperatures and long days to stay out late into the sunny night. Many restaurants and bars have patios and decks, so you can enjoy the evening light and lively ambiance. The big city also boasts Alaska's biggest and most diverse dining scene, from great burger joints and craft breweries to classic steakhouses and cosmopolitan cuisine.

The grid-based downtown is easy to navigate on foot, yet there's so much more to explore. Like historic Spenard, an artsy district with its own heritage and distinct personality. Or some of the 250 miles of trails within city limits, like the Tony Knowles Coastal Trail that starts in the city center and follows the waterfront.

To experience Alaska's varied culture, Anchorage has you covered, too. The Alaska Native Heritage Center is an acclaimed forum for storytellers, dancers and artisans dedicated to preserving and sharing the diverse traditions of Alaska's indigenous peoples. Bringing together art, history and science, the Anchorage Museum's planetarium showcases the wonders of the Alaskan skies. And the Alaska Museum of Science and Nature is fun for kids of all ages, with many hands-on exhibits.

FAIRBANKS - ALASKA'S GOLDEN HEART CITY.

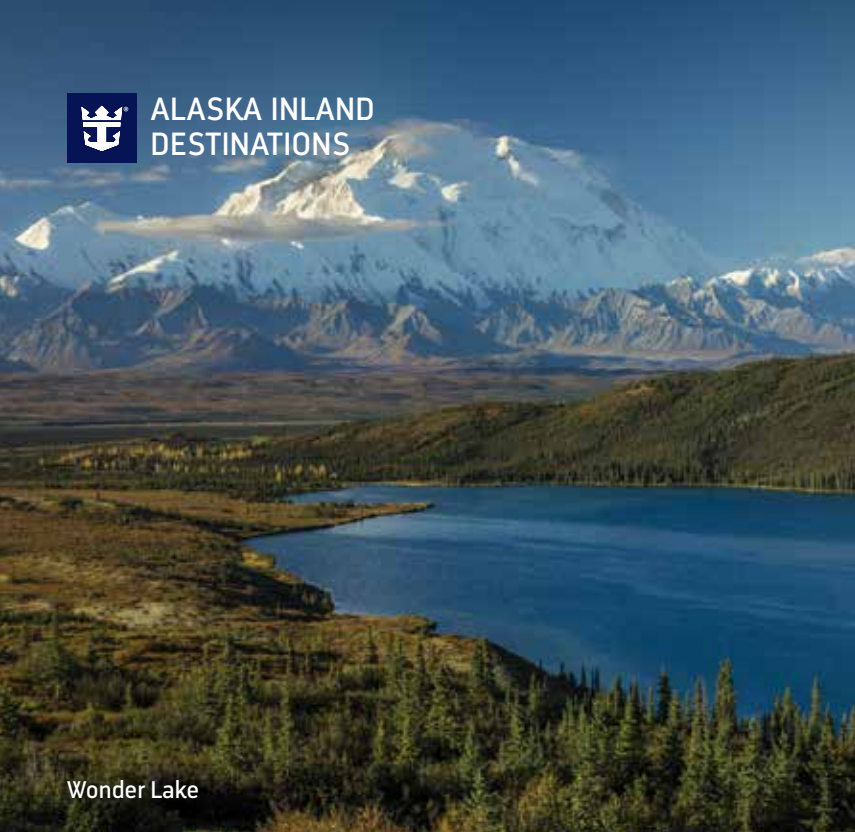
Back in 1901, E.T. Barnette ran aground in the shallows of the Chena, so he set up a trading post. A year later, the nearby discovery of gold transformed the remote settlement into a boomtown, and Barnette the first mayor. Fairbanks today remains a destination for adventure seekers, as the gateway to Alaska's northern wilds and some of its most isolated terrain.

In a valley crossed with rivers and streams, Fairbanks sits on the Chena, close to its juncture with the mighty Tanana. On clear days, the view south over the flats can extend to the Alaska Range. To the north, hills gradually rise up to meet the White Mountains. Winters mean frigid cold, long nights and the beauty of the Northern Lights. Summer brings balmy days, boundless sunshine and baseball under the midnight sun. In the warm months, the riverfront is abuzz, thanks to promenades and outdoor dining, along with

kayaks, canoes and old-fashioned sternwheelers on the water.

While home to just 32,000, Fairbanks is the big city of the interior and cultural hub for the sparsely populated region. The University of Alaska Fairbanks is a top global center for arctic and subarctic research. Its acclaimed Museum of the North showcases Alaska's geological, natural and cultural history through fascinating exhibits that include Blue Babe, the 36,000-year-old mummy of a steppe bison.

You can still go for the gold in Fairbanks, panning just like the early prospectors did. In the wilderness outside town, two intrepid miners founded the Chena Hot Springs resort whose warm, mineral-rich waters are still welcoming visitors more than a century later. Time spent in Fairbanks combines pioneer heritage with a deep appreciation of the surrounding natural beauty.



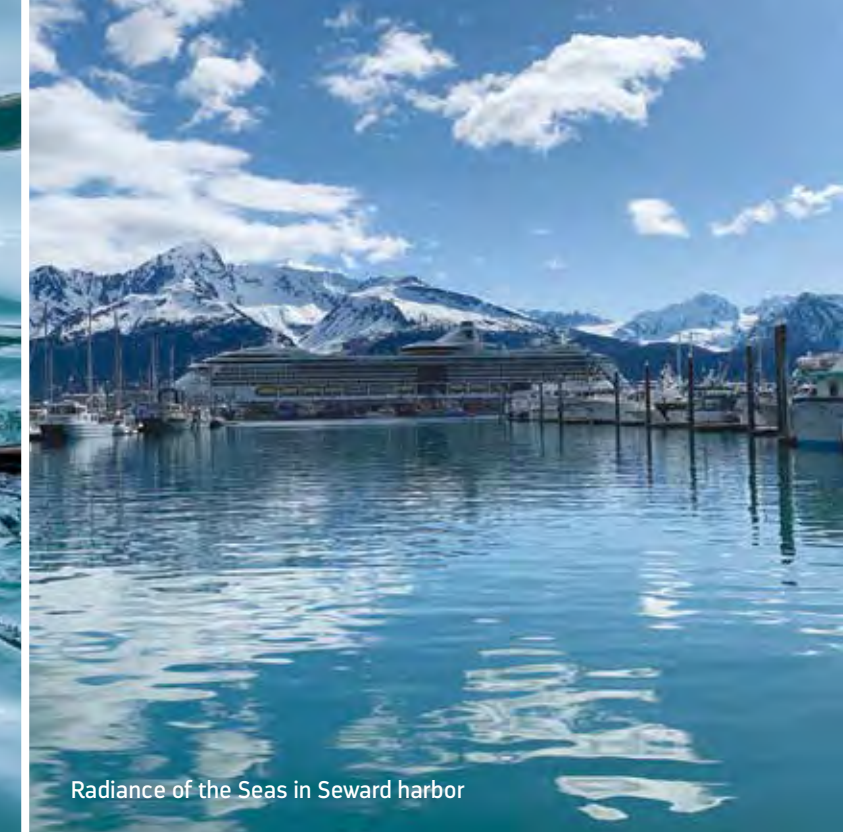

KANTISHNA - ADVENTURE BEGINS AT THE END OF THE ROAD.

The moment gold was discovered in the Kantishna Hills back in 1905, the rush was on. Fortune seekers descended on this remote spot deep in the wild. Then almost as quickly, the gold ran out.

After Denali National Park was established in 1916, the few prospectors who had stuck around were allowed to stay. Their former mining camp has been transformed into upscale lodgings, and is one of the few places to overnight inside Denali National Park proper. Even so, Kantishna remains far removed from the modern world, making it an exceptional place to connect with nature.

The park's one and only road ends in Kantishna. To protect the unspoiled character of the wilderness, access is limited and highly restricted. Few visitors to Denali will ever get to see the low valleys, high mountain passes and landscapes

of the 92-mile journey. These long stretches of the road less traveled also offer the greatest chances for seeing wildlife.

In the very heart of Denali, Kantishna is surrounded by the park's most iconic scenery. The hike to nearby Wonder Lake — less than an hour away on foot — is rewarded with an uninterrupted vista of the giant mountain, looming high in the distance. The lake itself is a prime spot to keep watch for wildlife, as animals regularly come to its shore to drink the pure glacial water.

Mountain biking on the old mining roads, meeting sled dogs doing off-season training, fly fishing, and panning for gold as the original prospectors once did are among the ways to experience Kantishna. At the end of the road is where your Denali backcountry adventures can begin.

SEWARD - A GLACIAL GATEWAY TOWN.

From the snow-capped peaks of the Chugach, the Kenai Peninsula extends from the mainland between the Cook Inlet and Prince William Sound, down to the Gulf of Alaska. Nicknamed Alaska's playground, the peninsula is remarkably diverse, encompassing wetlands and forest, rivers and lakes, a southern mountain range and an intricate coastline carved out by glaciers over thousands of years.

Perched at the head of Resurrection Bay, the picturesque seaport of Seward is the gateway to nearby Kenai Fjords National Park. Here the Ice Age maintains a cold grip: more than half of the park's landmass is a frozen expanse, covered by snow, glaciers and the massive Harding Icefield. Where the ice has retreated, the rainforest has taken hold,

populated by land animals like brown bears, wolverines and mountain goats. And where mountains, ice and ocean meet, the rugged seascapes and frosty waters support all manner of marine life, from colonies of nesting seabirds to sea lions, seals and pods of humpback whales.

One of the oldest communities in the state, Seward has a quaint downtown where you can stroll, enjoy a meal fresh off a fisherman's boat or relax in a local watering hole. Seward is also where the land and sea portions of a Royal Caribbean Cruisetour intersect. At the crossroads of maritime and interior Alaska, where the century-old sea routes meet the Alaska Railroad and scenic Seward Highway, one set of adventures comes to an end and a new one begins.

ALYESKA - WHERE DISCOVERY IS ALWAYS IN SEASON.

Girdwood is a popular getaway from Anchorage, a mere 38 miles away along the shores of the Turnagain Arm waterway on one of the most scenic stretches of the Seward Highway. Visitors are drawn to the town's majestic setting in a verdant valley, surrounded by the Chugach Mountains and seven hanging glaciers.

Unique among Alaska's resort towns, Girdwood is a destination for all seasons. It is home to a small, tight-knit, and decidedly eclectic community of year-round residents. The compact center is dotted with coffee shops, casual eateries and fine restaurants where visitors and locals fuel up before and after their excursions into the Chugach Mountains and National Forest.

The Alyeska Resort is base camp at its most luxurious.

Nestled into the forest at the foot of Mount Alyeska, it features such premium amenities as a full-service spa, elegant fine dining and a saltwater pool with mountain views. Right outside your room, the great outdoors is yours to explore. A number of scenic strolls, mountain-biking trails and hikes begin on the resort's grounds.

For the most daring travelers, there are glaciers to climb. But no visit to Girdwood is complete without riding the aerial tram to the summit of Mount Alyeska. In a matter of minutes, you're transported to the best spot for picture-postcard views of the high, snow-capped peaks, down to the valley below and the shimmering waters of the Turnagain Arm.

TALKEETNA - SMALL TOWN. BIG ADVENTURE.

Built at the junction of three glacial rivers, Talkeetna is one of Alaska's most unique spots, an eclectic, offbeat community set amid incomparable scenic beauty. When the skies are clear and clouds lift, panoramic vistas of Denali and the other snow-covered mountains of the Alaskan Range are revealed from different points all over town.

With pioneer heritage, a quaint main street lined with vintage clapboard buildings and an independent streak, this village of just 800 people has the same qualities as many other historic Alaskan towns. Yet tiny Talkeetna has an outsized reputation as the funkiest place in the state.

In the summer months, Talkeetna welcomes climbers from around the world seeking to conquer the rugged peaks.

Other visitors opt to reach the summits by plane, which delivers the best views and the opportunity to touch down on a nearby glacier.

Close to downtown, the Talkeetna, Susitna, and Chulitna rivers come together to form the Big Susitna. There you'll find rafting adventures, fishing and jet-boat rides, as well as an enormous park where you can stroll down to the water's edge and walk along gravelly sand bars.

Locals and visitors alike gather, relax and recharge in the bars, restaurants and roadhouses of the historic downtown. You may share a local microbrew with a bush pilot or with an artist whose works are on display in a local gallery. This frontier hospitality is part of Talkeetna's special charm.

Take a journey into Fairbanks' pioneering past aboard a vintage-style sternwheeler as she gently churns along the waters of the Chena. More than a river cruise, the Riverboat Discovery includes memorable stops along the way. A guided tour of an Athabascan Indian village is your introduction to the everyday lives and enduring traditions of the people whose ancestors settled here thousands of years ago. The spirit of Iditarod champion Susan Butcher lives on at the Trailblazer Kennels, where you'll meet sled dogs in training, their handlers and some playful pups. And be enthralled at the sight of a bush plane touching down alongside the Discovery.

The discovery of gold transformed Alaska, and the Gold Dredge 8 tour brings the state's gold rush history and mining heritage to life. Over three decades, the pan-like dredge extracted gold just outside downtown Fairbanks. Years after closing, it reopened as a national historic district and is a popular attraction. You'll travel there aboard a replica narrow-gauge train whose conductor shares tales of the early prospectors. Then watch the giant dredge — itself an engineering landmark — in action before getting hands-on, panning for gold the old-fashioned way.



ALYESKA AERIAL TRAM (ALYESKA)

Outside of a flightseeing tour, the Alyeska Aerial Tram in Girdwood delivers Alaska's best panoramic views in a matter of minutes. From the Alyeska Resort at the base of Mount Alyeska, you'll ascend 2,300 feet to the summit. From the tram, you can see for miles, with even more expansive vistas from the mountaintop observation deck. The panorama includes the seven hanging glaciers and the snow-capped peaks of the Chugach Mountains, the forested Chugach valley and out to the sparkling waters of the Turnagain Arm waterway. Be sure to look down, too, and you may see wildlife ambling across the mountain's slope.



DENALI NATURAL HISTORY TOUR / TUNDRA WILDERNESS TOUR (DENALI)

Only one road extends into the untamed wilds, cutting through evergreen forest, up into the higher elevations that open out onto tundra and river valleys extending up to the Alaska Range. Your sharp-eyed guide is the lookout for all the creatures, great and small, though sightings of the Big Five — moose, grizzly bears, caribou, wolves and Dall sheep — depend on luck and timing. The Denali Natural History Tour focuses on the park's natural and cultural history, traveling to Teklanika River (mile 30) with stops along the way. The Tundra Wilderness Tour goes deeper into the park — up to 62 miles — featuring more diverse scenery, additional stops and, when the weather is clear, an amazing view of the great mountain.



ALASKA NATIVE HERITAGE CENTER (ANCHORAGE)
Discover the diversity of Alaska’s indigenous communities — Yup’ik, Cup’ik, Iñupiaq, Athabascan, Tlingit, Alutiiq and more — at this acclaimed institution. More than a museum, the center is a forum for the storytellers, dancers and artisans who are dedicated to sharing their heritage and to preserving their languages and customs. The Welcome House is a celebration of contemporary Alaska Native cultures, while the outdoor facilities and sites on the center’s 26-acre wooded campus allow you to explore ancient traditions and architectural styles that have been passed down through the generations.



ALASKA WILDLIFE CONSERVATION CENTER (ALYESKA)
Near the very end of the Turnagain Arm Waterway, along the scenic Seward Highway, this center provides a sanctuary for native Alaskan animals in need. Here you can get up close to the orphaned, injured or displaced animals, all under expert care in their natural habitats so that they can be reintroduced into the wild. The resident population varies by the season but can include caribou and moose calves, fawns, porcupines, birds, lynx, and brown and black bears. The gift shop is a great place to look for souvenirs and unique wares created by Alaskan artisans, the proceeds of which support animal care.



RESURRECTION BAY WILDLIFE CRUISE (SEWARD)
The port of Seward sits at the head of the scenic bay that is surrounded by jagged cliffs and forested mountains, with views up to the surrounding glaciers. Where ocean, ice and mountains meet, a diverse variety of wildlife flourishes. Setting off from the picturesque small-boat harbor, enjoy a narrated tour as you cruise close to shore on the lookout for sea otters, sea lions and whales in the frosty waters. Stop at a small private island for an Alaskan buffet, a presentation by a park ranger and a chance to stroll along the “skipping stone” beach.



ALASKA SEALIFE CENTER (SEWARD)
The marine-research institution and aquarium in Seward is Alaska’s only permanent rehabilitation facility dedicated to the care of marine mammals. Dedicated to understanding and protecting the state’s marine ecosystems, it allows visitors to explore the underwater world of the cold northern seas. You’ll see a variety of native species: marine mammals like harbor seals, Stellar sea lions and sea otters; sea puffins, long-tailed ducks and other birds; fish like coho salmon and wolf eels; and invertebrates such as the giant Pacific octopus and red king crab. Meet the people who care for these creatures and enjoy a close encounter at a feeding. A memorable experience for animal lovers of all ages.

ALYESKA RESORT



The Alyeska Resort is a luxurious retreat in a spectacular alpine setting at the base of Mount Alyeska. Its amenities include a spa, fine dining and a saltwater pool with mountains views. Wooded paths and trails that begin on the property take you up the slopes of the Chugach Mountains. But for the best views of the snow-capped range, the surrounding seven glaciers and the verdant valley below, ride the aerial tram up 2,300 feet to the summit of Mount Alyeska.

DENALI PARK VILLAGE



Close to the entrance of Denali National Park, Denali Park Village is the perfect base for exploring the greatest wilderness of the Alaskan interior. Its rustic-style buildings are nestled into 20 acres of forest along the Nenana River, where wildlife sightings are not uncommon. Hiking and interpretive paths cross the expansive site, and rafting trips begin right here, too. The main lodge has a coffee shop, saloon, casual restaurant and dinner theater, plus a terrace where you can watch and listen to the rushing river waters.

TALKEETNA ALASKAN LODGE



Built atop a ridge, the Talkeetna Alaskan Lodge is arguably the state's hotel with the most iconic scenery. On clear days, the lobby and restaurants enjoy panoramic vistas of Denali and the Alaskan Range, their snow-covered peaks shimmering in the golden light late on summer evenings. The lodge is surrounded by walking and hiking trails. Nearby, Talkeetna's three rivers beckon with adventures that range from laid-back float trips to jet boat thrills. The lodge offers casual and fine dining on site, and is just minutes from the village's cafes, roadhouses, bars and food trucks.

PIKES WATERFRONT LODGE



Homesteader Lloyd Pike built Pike's Landing on the banks of the Chena back in 1959 and this Fairbanks institution remains a family-run enterprise. True to the Alaskan spirit, Pike's has a style all its own, with displays of original works by Alaskan artists, resident ducks and a greenhouse that supplies fresh vegetables all summer long. You can play mini golf and bocce ball here, stroll the riverfront and enjoy drinks and dinner on the lively outdoor patio. And it's easy to explore, with attractions like the Museum of the North and downtown less than 15 minutes away.

guests are required to have a valid passport that is valid for at least 6 months after the cruise.

International Travel
A valid passport book is required; visas are required where they apply. This includes Europe, Asia, and Australia/New Zealand. For additional passport information visit: [www.travel.state.gov](#)

Our Recommendation
Royal Caribbean International® strongly recommends that all guests travel with a valid passport book during their cruise. This greatly assists guests who may need to fly out of the United States to meet their ship at the next available port should they miss their scheduled embarkation in a U.S. port; guests entering the U.S. at the end of their cruise; and guests needing to fly to the U.S. before their cruise ends because of medical, family, personal or business emergencies, missing a ship's departure from a port-of-call, involuntary disembarkation from a ship due to misconduct, or other reasons. Guests who need to fly to the United States before their cruise ends will likely experience significant delays and complications related to booking airline tickets and entering the United States if they do not have a valid U.S. passport book with them. Non-U.S. Citizens
You will need a valid passport book and, in some cases, a visa. If you live in the U.S., you will also need the original copy of your Alien Registration Card (ARC or "Green Card") and any other documentation the countries on your itinerary require due to your alien status.

Canadian Landed Immigrants
All Canadian Landed Immigrants (inclusive of those who are citizens of the British Commonwealth countries) who reside in Canada must have valid passport and U.S. visas. Also required is the original copy of your Permanent Resident Card (PR Card), formerly the IMM 1000, or with respect to any country on the itinerary, any other travel documentation required because of alien status.

For voyages that begin and end in the same U.S. port, U.S. citizen guests may travel with both a Government-issued birth certificate** and Government issued picture ID card, such as a drivers' license.

Alien Registration Card (Green Card)
U.S. lawful permanent residents will continue to be able to use their Alien Registration Card issued by the Department of Homeland Security or other valid evidence of permanent residence status to apply for entry to the United States. Card renewal is an important matter. ARC holders (United States permanent residents) with expired cards may be considered "out of status" and may be denied entry/reentry into the United States. If your ARC was issued over 10 years ago, you should check the expiration date printed on the front of the card. If your card is expired or it is about to expire, you should renew your card before you sail. If you are holding an old-edition ARC WITHOUT an expiration date, you will not be detained from entering the United States, but U.S. Customs and Border Protection highly suggests that you apply for a new card before you sail. Visa
For specific visa requirements, information, forms and fees for your nationality, please contact the Embassy (Consular Services) of each country on your sailing itinerary or a visa service provider such as CIBT at [www.cibt.com/rci](#) or 1-800-858-8579 (identify yourself as a Royal Caribbean® guest for discounted rates).

Visa Waiver Program
This is a pre-travel authorization program for U.S.-bound travelers from Visa Waiver countries. This U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) program, the Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA) is mandatory, and all travelers, regardless of age, from Visa Waiver Program (VWP) countries will be required to complete an online application similar to the I-94W and obtain an ESTA approval prior to boarding a carrier by air or sea to the United States under the VWP. A third party, such as a relative or Travel Advisor, will be permitted to submit an ESTA application on behalf of a VWP traveler. The DHS recommends that an ESTA approval be obtained as soon as a VWP traveler begins to plan a trip to the United States and no later than 72 hours before departure. Should the information you provided change after receiving your approval, updating your application online is easy.

ESTA will determine almost immediately in many cases if an individual is eligible for VWP travel. Possible website responses include: Authorization Approved, Travel Not Approved, or Authorization Pending. In the event that an ESTA applicant is denied authorization to travel to the United States under VWP, he or she will be referred to U.S. Department of State website for information on how to apply for a visa to travel to the United States. Applicants who receive an Authorization Pending response will need to check the website for updates within 72 hours to receive a

final response.
An approved ESTA travel authorization is:
• valid for up to two years or until the traveler's passport book expires, whichever comes first;
• valid for multiple entries into the U.S. be it for business or pleasure; and
• not a guarantee of admissibility to the United States at a port of entry. ESTA approval only authorizes a traveler to board a carrier for travel to the U.S. under VWP. In all cases, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officers make admissibility determinations at U.S. ports of entry. (For additional information please visit "Know Before You Go" at the [CBP.gov](#) website.)

Guests who apply electronically will be required to present their ESTA authorization approval receipt in order to board the vessel on applicable voyages.

Countries Participating In The Visa Waiver Program
Andorra, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brunei, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Monaco, The Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal, San Marino, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland and United Kingdom. Travelers from the VWP countries seeking to enter the United States will also be required to have a passport book in their possession. Pre-Travel Authorization Program for U.S.-Bound Travelers from Visa Waiver Countries
This U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) program has a mandatory effective date of January 12, 2009. On this date, subject to DHS modification, the Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA) became mandatory, and all travelers, regardless of age, from Visa Waiver Program (VWP) countries will be required to complete an online application similar to the I-94W and obtain an ESTA approval prior to boarding a carrier by air or sea to the United States under the VWP. Inoculation/Health
As detailed in our brochure, all guests must ensure they are medically fit for travel. As such, we remind you to check with your physician at least 4 to 6 weeks before sailing to make sure you are up to date with any required immunizations or vaccines you may need (including but not limited to certification of yellow fever vaccination) to ensure you will be permitted to visit each of the exciting destinations and tours on your itinerary.

Family Legal Documents
Should the last names of the parent sailing with their minor child differ, the parent is required to present the child's valid passport book and visa (if required) and the child's birth certificate (original, a notarized copy or a certified copy). The name of the parent(s) and the child must be linked through legal documentation. Adults who are not the parent or legal guardian of any minor child traveling with them are required to present the child's valid passport and visa (if required) or the child's birth certificate (original, a notarized copy or a certified copy) and an original notarized letter signed by at least one of the child's parents. The notarized letter from the child's parent must authorize the traveling adult to take the child on the specific cruise and must authorize the traveling adult to supervise the child and permit any medical treatment that must be administered to the child. If a non-parent adult is a legal guardian, the adult must present a certified Certificate of Guardianship with respect to the child.

***A 'birth certificate' is issued by a government agency (state, county, city, etc.). This document (with seal and signature) is legal proof of citizenship that can be used by U.S. citizens for certain international travel. A 'birth notice' is issued by a hospital or other type of medical facility but it is not an approved travel document; it is a courtesy document that merely indicates where a birth occurred. It has no legal status and cannot be used to prove citizenship for international travel purposes. Therefore, please note baptismal papers and hospital certificates are NOT acceptable. Additionally, voter registration cards or Social Security cards are NOT considered proof of citizenship.*

What Are The Gratuity Guidelines For Cruises?

Royal Caribbean’s onboard staff and crew await our guests with personalized Royal Way service®. Royal Caribbean® will add a daily US\$13.50 gratuity (US\$16.50 for suite guests) to each guest’s onboard SeaPass® account. The gratuities will be shared by the Dining Services Staff (waiter, assistant waiter and head waiter), Stateroom Attendants and Other Housekeeping Services Personnel who work to enhance your cruise. Alternatively, guests may prepay gratuities prior to boarding by calling Royal Caribbean® or your travel advisor. Guests who prepay gratuities will not have an automatic daily gratuity added to their SeaPass® account.

An 18% gratuity is also automatically added to beverages, mini-bar items, spa & salon purchases. Many of our guests wish to reward exceptional service during their cruise by providing additional gratuities. Guests may do so by providing an additional gratuity to their SeaPass® onboard account or a cash gratuity at their discretion.

What Are The Gratuity Guidelines For Cruisetours?

• *Alaska Adventure Specialist: US\$3.50 a day, per guest*

• *Alaska Traincar Host: US\$100 a day, per guest*

• *Alaska Motorcoach Driver: US\$2.50 a day, per guest*

Does The Name On My Reservation Need To Match The Name On My Passport?

Yes, it is important that the name on your reservation be exactly as it is stated on your passport or other official proof of nationality. If your name has changed since your document was issued (e.g., marriage/divorce), it is required that you update the document with the new name or provide an official supporting document of the name change (e.g., marriage certificate). Otherwise, it may result in delay or possible denial of boarding.

What About Guests With Disabilities?

Royal Caribbean International® welcomes guests with disabilities and works hard to assist them throughout their vacation. Guests should ensure that they are medically and physically fit for travel and that such traveling will not endanger their well-being or the well-being of others. Our personnel are not required to perform personal tasks (e.g., assisting with eating, dressing, toileting or lifting); therefore, guests who require assistance with these functions should consider these needs when making a booking. If there is a question regarding the guest’s fitness to travel without personal assistance, this must be discussed with our Access Department.

While we do not require information about your disability, the more information you can share with us about your specific needs, the better we will be able to assist you. We encourage you to notify us of your needs at the time of booking; however, to guarantee availability of specific equipment or services, please provide:

- 60 days’ advance notice for sign language interpreting services
- 30 days’ advance notice for special equipment or services

Guests with medical concerns are advised to check with their physician before sailing. Tendering may preclude guests from going ashore at certain ports of call.

Alaska Cruisetours are accessible; however, other Cruisetours cannot accommodate full-time wheelchair users. Please contact the Access department to notify us of your accommodation needs.

Designated Staterooms: Accessible staterooms are offered on all Royal Caribbean ships in different

categories. They are designed for guests with mobility disabilities and other disabilities that require the use of the accessible features of the staterooms. Accessible staterooms are held for people with disabilities until all other non-accessible staterooms in that category are reserved. Upon reserving an accessible stateroom, we require our guests to acknowledge in writing the need for an accessible stateroom by completing a Guest Special Needs Form. This form may be filled out online at RoyalCaribbean.com/specialneedsform. Guests without a disability booked in an accessible stateroom may be moved at any time to accommodate a guest with a disability.

Assistive Devices: Guests may bring and use onboard wheelchairs, mobility scooters and other assistive devices. Due to safety reasons, a Segway® may not be used on board. Assistive devices, including mobility scooters, must be stored and recharged in staterooms so fire doors, corridors and elevator lobbies are kept clear for emergency evacuation. When parked throughout the ship, they must be parked out of the way to allow safe and easy access by other guests and crew members. Assistive devices should fit through a standard stateroom entry doorway which is at least 23 inches wide. We offer accessible staterooms with wider doors which are at least 32 inches wide and may accommodate larger devices. Crew members are not permitted to lift assistive devices.

Oxygen: Guests dependent on oxygen or requiring oxygen therapy must notify the Access Department prior to boarding the ship.

Pregnancy: Royal Caribbean® will not accept guests who will enter their 24th week of pregnancy by the beginning, or any time during the cruise or Cruisetour. All guests are required to sign a health questionnaire at check-in to ensure they are aware of our pregnancy policy. Please contact us if you have already reserved your cruise and do not meet this requirement. For details go to RoyalCaribbean.com/FAQ

Infant Policy: Infants sailing on a cruise must be at least 6 months old as of the first day of the cruise/Cruisetour. For transatlantic, transpacific, Hawaii and other selected cruises/Cruisetours, the child must be at least 12 months old as of the first day of the cruise. For details go to RoyalCaribbean.com/FAQ

Any Cruisetours associated with these cruises are also subject to the 12-month minimum age requirement. Denial of boarding for infants who do not satisfy these minimum age requirements may also result in the denial of boarding for one or more guests sailing with that infant. No refunds or other compensation shall be due from the cruise line to anyone as a result of the denial of boarding to an underage infant or other accompanying guests.

Onboard Physicians: Each Royal Caribbean® vessel is equipped with a medical facility. At least one licensed physician and two nurses are normally in attendance on all cruises. Guests will be charged for medical services, and medications are available on board for a fee. The types of medications kept on board are limited, and guests must bring an adequate supply of any specific medications they need. The medical facility is not intended or designed to serve as a clinic for guests, and Royal Caribbean® is not responsible for the diagnosis, treatment or services furnished by shipboard medical personnel.

What About Advanced Or Delayed Sailings And Changes In Itinerary?

In the event of strikes, lockouts, riots, weather conditions or mechanical difficulties, or for any other reason whatsoever, Royal Caribbean® may, at any time and without prior notice, cancel, advance, postpone

or deviate from any scheduled sailing or port of call and may, but is not obliged to, substitute another ship or port of call and shall not be liable for any loss whatsoever to guests by reason of such cancellation, advancement, postponement, deviation or substitution. Royal Caribbean® shall not be responsible for any failure to adhere to the arrival and departure times published in this brochure for any of its ports of call.

While every effort will be made to adhere to the specifics shown herein for a cruise, circumstances may necessitate changes or deviations therefrom. All schedules, itinerary destinations, hours of arrival and departure, hotel and/or conveyances and other aspects of Cruisetour programs are subject to change without prior notice. Neither Royal Caribbean® nor any affiliated party shall be required to refund any portion of fare or other charges or make any compensation under these circumstances.

How Are Disputes Settled?

Any dispute between a guest and Royal Caribbean® in connection with a guest’s cruise booking or cruise vacation shall be litigated, if at all, in and before a court located in Miami, Florida, USA, to the exclusion of the courts of any other state, territory or country.

Can Passage Or A Booking Request Be Refused?

We are delighted to have provided a safe and enjoyable cruise to millions of guests over the years. To facilitate our ability to continue to provide safe and enjoyable cruises to our guests, we reserve the right to refuse to accept a booking request from an individual or group and reserve the right to cancel an existing reservation. For more details, see our Refusal to Transport Policy and Guest Conduct Policy, each of which is available online at RoyalCaribbean.com/FAQ. The Refusal to Transport Policy provides, among other things, that a booking request may be denied, for example, where the guest’s conduct on a prior cruise has resulted in disciplinary measures by Royal Caribbean®.

Royal Caribbean® is not liable for its refusal to transport any passenger or for its removal of any guest in accordance with these policies. In addition, Royal Caribbean® shall not be required to refund any amount paid by any guest who must leave the cruise vacation prematurely pursuant to either policy, nor shall Royal Caribbean® be responsible for lodging, meals, return transportation or other expenses incurred by the guest or for any consequential or punitive damages.

What Are The Conditions Of My Cruise/Cruisetour Ticket Contract?

The transportation of guests and baggage on Royal Caribbean® ships is governed by the terms and conditions of the Cruise Ticket Contract included as part of the cruise documentation. The Cruise Ticket Contract limits your rights. The Cruise Ticket Contract sets forth limitations on the time frames in which claims may be made and suits may be filed against Royal Caribbean®. What Are The Terms And Conditions Of My Cruisetour?

Transportation aboard the ship is provided solely by Royal Caribbean International®. Independent third-party Cruisetour operators provide all of the land portion of the Cruisetours or will arrange for independent contractors to provide all or part of the land portion. To the extent your Cruisetour operator makes arrangements with independent contractors, it does so only as a convenience to the guest. Those portions of the land tours that are performed by independent contractors are solely at guests’ risk and subject to the terms or arrangements made by them or on their behalf with the independent contractor. Neither Royal Caribbean® nor your Cruisetour operator assume responsibility with respect to the services provided by independent contractors (including cancellation, delay, injury, death or damage to property) even though Royal Caribbean® or your Cruisetour operator may collect monies or make bookings. Each guest agrees not to hold Royal Caribbean® or the Cruisetour operator or their agents or representatives liable for any loss, injury, expense or damage that results directly or indirectly from any act or omission of any independent contractor that provides any aspect of their land tour. Royal Caribbean’s liability for those portions of the land tour provided by your Cruisetour operator shall be as specified in the Cruise Ticket Contract. Royal Caribbean® is not responsible for any substitutions, deviations, variations or changes to the land tour portion; contact the independent contractor for information about their right to make such changes. CANCELLATIONS: If Royal Caribbean® or your Cruisetour operator cancels a land tour, it will rebook guests on the same tour with a different departure date or a similar tour. What Is The Guest’s Liability?

Each guest agrees to indemnify Royal Caribbean® for all penalties, fines, charges, losses or expenses incurred or imposed upon Royal Caribbean® by virtue of any act, omission, or violation of law by the guest. Each guest or, if a minor, his or her parent or guardian, shall be liable to and shall reimburse Royal Caribbean® for all damage to the ship and its furnishings and equipment, or any property of the ship caused by any willful or negligent act or omission on the part of the guest.

What About My Personal Property?

Under no circumstances may dangerous articles such as controlled substances, firearms, explosives, cylinders containing compressed air or combustible substances, etc. be contained in any baggage or brought by any person onboard. Royal Caribbean® reserves the right to refuse to permit any guest to take onboard any items Royal Caribbean® deems inappropriate. No animals are permitted onboard (with the exception of service animals for guests with disabilities). Property lost or damaged should be reported to either the Purser’s/Guest Relations Desk or to a designated Royal Caribbean® employee prior to leaving the U.S. Customs area. In any event, property lost or damaged must be reported within the time limitations and in accordance with the procedures set forth in the Cruise Ticket Contract. In the absence of negligence on its part, Royal Caribbean® is not responsible for any loss, theft, pilferage and/or damage to a guest’s property, which includes items such as money, travel currency, jewelry of any kind, photographic/electronic equipment, or other personal property. Royal Caribbean’s liability for loss or damage to property shall be limited otherwise in accordance with the provisions of the Cruise Ticket Contract.

As A Parent/Guardian, Can I Be Held Responsible For The Child Cruising With Me?

If a child is cruising under your supervision and exhibits dangerous or disruptive behavior (e.g., excessive drunkenness, fighting, verbal abuse of a staff member, unruly behavior, vandalism in any public areas, etc.), the parent/guardian will be held accountable.

Can Minors Sail If Not Accompanied By A Legal Guardian?

Guests under the age of 21 must be booked in a stateroom with an adult who is 21 years or older. A parent or legal guardian must accompany guests under the age of 21 and must be booked in the same or adjacent stateroom. The only situations where minors (under 21) can be berthed without an adult (21 or older) in a stateroom are when at least one parent is sailing or when the stateroom guests are legally married. Acceptable proof will be required. These restrictions may be waived at our discretion, where applicable. All non-family children under the age of 18 must have a notarized letter from one parent or guardian authorizing sailing with the family, plus authorization to allow emergency medical treatment and any other permissions necessary while on board. Grandparents or any other relatives cannot be a substitute for a parent. All school groups or Quinceañera groups traveling with a chaperone must have waivers pre-signed. These waivers can be given to the Group Leader or Travel Partner from their Groups Agent at Royal Caribbean International®.

Please note: An individual’s age on the date of departure determines his or her status for the entire cruise vacation. Royal Caribbean International® does not accept bookings for student groups. Please consult a Travel Advisor for Royal Caribbean® group policies.

What About Security?

The highest priority of Royal Caribbean® is to ensure the safety and security of all guests. In order to maintain an effective and meaningful security environment and to comply with international and national security laws, regulations and guidelines, Royal Caribbean® has established strict security procedures in the seaport terminals we utilize and onboard all our vessels.
